Historic building with private garden. Superb Renaissance palace, ancient residence of the Piccolomini counts, as evidenced by the coat of arms above the entrance door and witness of sumptuous pasts given that Pope Enea Piccolomini, Silvio Piccolomini and the poet Giosuè Carducci stayed there. It is located in the ancient medieval village in the south of the Tuscan countryside characterized by numerous Renaissance palaces that testify to its importance being located not only in the Val D'Orcia area, Unesco heritage, but also along the Via Francigena on the border between Umbria and Lazio, just 4 km from the famous Fonteverde spa in San Casciano dei Bagni. The palace has been skilfully renovated keeping its Renaissance character intact and all those details that make it even more prestigious and real, for those who enter it for the first time, that sensation of taking a dive into the past world of the Renaissance nobility. It spreads over 630 square meters divided into ground floor, first floor and second floor with an internal garden with a well from the 1600s and a cellar dug into the tuff. On the ground floor we can find rooms with original floors where the carriages accessed and semicircle walls to be able to park them, an ancient kitchen, the cellar, a dining room, entrance to the garden and a bathroom. Going upstairs we find a living room, a dining room with access to the garden both frescoed, a kitchen, three bedrooms and two bathrooms. On the second floor there are six bedrooms all with private bathrooms, a study and a dressing room. As service rooms we find on the ground floor a technical room and a garage.
